Emblem of the University

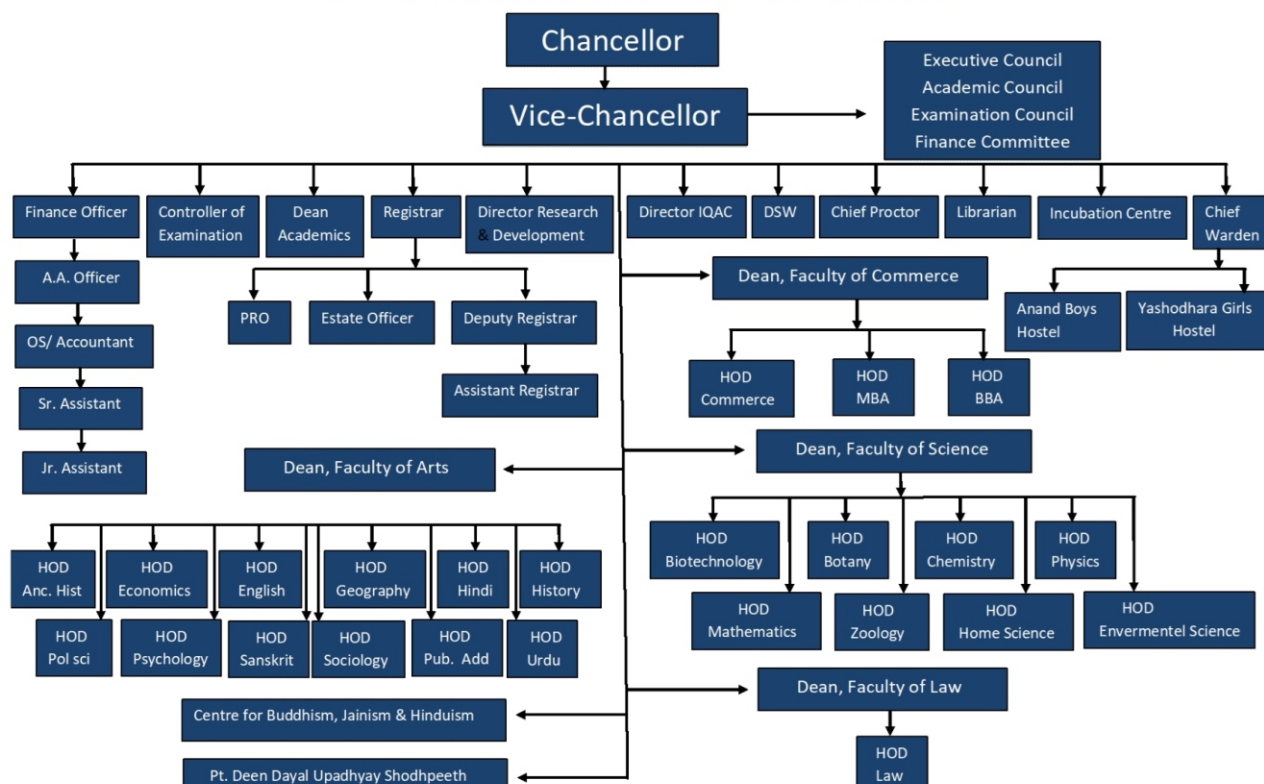

Brief Report of IQAC

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharth Nagar, functioned as the central quality assurance and enhancement mechanism of the University during the academic session 2025–26. Under the leadership of the Vice-Chancellor and with the active participation of internal and external experts, the IQAC continued its efforts towards institutional excellence, quality sustenance, and continuous improvement in academic and administrative processes.

Established in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission and the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), the IQAC serves as a catalyst for promoting a culture of quality within the University. The Cell comprises distinguished academicians, administrators, scientists, industry representatives, and faculty members who collectively contribute to policy formulation, strategic planning, and quality enhancement initiatives.

During the academic session 2025–26, the IQAC conducted a series of meetings focused on quality assurance, accreditation preparedness, academic reforms, and institutional development. The discussions centered on the implementation of the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) through the e-Samarth platform, streamlining Self-Assessment Applications, aligning annual performance evaluation mechanisms with the calendar year, and establishing institutional quality benchmarks. Special attention was given to long-term strategic planning, stakeholder feedback analysis, and the development of a comprehensive roadmap for quality enhancement.

One of the major priorities of IQAC during the year was preparing the University for NAAC accreditation. Extensive gap analysis was undertaken to identify institutional strengths, areas for improvement, and documentation requirements. The Cell coordinated various departments and administrative units to ensure systematic data collection, evidence generation, and quality documentation. Simultaneously, the University submitted applications for participation in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2026 under the Overall and Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) categories, demonstrating its commitment to benchmarking institutional performance against national standards.

The IQAC also played a significant role in organizing capacity-building programmes and quality enhancement workshops. A workshop on Curriculum Design and Preparation of Boards of Studies in accordance with NEP 2020 was conducted to facilitate curriculum restructuring and multidisciplinary learning. The programme emphasized outcome-based education, skill integration, and academic flexibility. Subsequently, a Management Development Programme on Leadership for Institutional Transformation was organized for academic leaders and affiliated college principals, focusing on quality assurance, governance reforms, digital transformation, and effective implementation of NEP 2020.

In alignment with the national vision of *Viksit Bharat*, the IQAC organized a multidisciplinary workshop on Education, Healthcare, and Rural Governance. The event explored the role of higher education institutions in promoting rural development, social inclusion, healthcare awareness, and community engagement. Another major workshop on Technology, Education, and Innovation-Based Possibilities for School Leaders highlighted the transformative role of artificial intelligence, digital learning, blended education, and technological advancements in contemporary education systems. These initiatives significantly contributed to quality awareness and institutional capacity building among stakeholders.

The University introduced value-added and vocational courses in areas such as Computer Applications, Environmental Science, Visual Arts, and Performing Arts. Efforts were initiated to launch specialized programmes in Artificial Intelligence and Cybersecurity, thereby aligning academic offerings with emerging industry requirements and future workforce demands. The integration of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) and SWAYAM courses into undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programmes further strengthened digital learning opportunities and promoted flexible, learner-centric education.

To improve academic administration and governance, IQAC facilitated the adoption of e-Samarth-based academic and administrative procedures. Departments were encouraged to digitize records, streamline workflows, and strengthen documentation practices. The implementation of online systems contributed significantly to transparency, efficiency, and accountability in institutional functioning.

The University also strengthened its collaborative ecosystem through strategic partnerships and academic networking. During the year, nine new Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) were signed with reputed institutions and organizations, adding to the University's growing portfolio of twenty-nine collaborative agreements, including four international partnerships. These collaborations are expected to facilitate joint research, faculty exchange, student mobility, internships, and capacity-building activities. Clear responsibilities were assigned to concerned stakeholders to ensure effective implementation and monitoring of these collaborations.

Brief Report of the Office of Registrar

Academic Year 2025–26

(Strengthening Governance, Transparency and Institutional Excellence)

The Academic Year 2025–26 marked another significant phase in the administrative evolution of Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharth Nagar. Guided by the principles of transparency, accountability, efficiency, digital governance, and stakeholder-centric administration, the University Administration continued to play a pivotal role in supporting academic growth, institutional quality enhancement, and regulatory compliance. The Registrar's Office, functioning as the administrative backbone of the University, coordinated various statutory, academic, financial, and developmental activities aimed at strengthening institutional governance and enhancing service delivery.

The year witnessed a sustained emphasis on improving administrative systems, streamlining procedures, promoting digital transformation, ensuring timely decision-making, and facilitating effective coordination among academic departments, administrative units, statutory bodies, affiliated colleges, regulatory authorities, and other stakeholders.

1.Regulatory Compliance and Governance Framework

During the year, the University Administration ensured strict adherence to the provisions of the Siddharth University Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Government Orders, UGC Regulations, and directives, as applicable and issued by various regulatory agencies. Continuous monitoring mechanisms were established to ensure that institutional policies and administrative decisions remained aligned with the evolving higher education landscape.

The University maintained active correspondence and coordination with the Department of Higher Education, Government of Uttar Pradesh, University Grants Commission (UGC), Raj Bhavan, and other statutory authorities. Administrative actions were undertaken to ensure timely submission of reports, compliance documentation, policy updates, and implementation of regulatory guidelines.

Special attention was given to strengthening governance through systematic review and implementation of decisions taken by various statutory bodies. The administration ensured that institutional processes remained legally compliant, procedurally robust, and academically supportive.

2.Effective Functioning of Statutory Bodies

The University Administration successfully facilitated the functioning of major statutory authorities and committees. Meetings of the Executive Council, Academic Council, Finance Committee, Building Committee, and other statutory and advisory bodies were convened in accordance with prescribed norms.

Agenda preparation, documentation, record maintenance, implementation tracking, and follow-up actions were systematically undertaken. The establishment of an institutional monitoring mechanism enabled effective implementation of resolutions and enhanced administrative accountability.

The strengthening of committee-based governance significantly contributed to participatory decision-making and institutional transparency.

3. Digital Transformation and E-Governance Initiatives

One of the major achievements of the year was the continued expansion of digital governance practices across administrative functions. Recognizing the importance of technology-enabled administration, the University further strengthened its e-office framework and digital record management systems.

4. Administrative Reforms and Process Optimization

Standard operating practices were reviewed, and efforts were made to simplify procedures wherever feasible. Administrative bottlenecks were identified and addressed through process rationalization and improved inter-departmental coordination.

The University administration worked towards standardization of office procedures, systematic maintenance of records, and enhanced documentation practices. Efforts were also undertaken to improve file disposal mechanisms and strengthen accountability in administrative workflows.

These reforms contributed to timely decision-making, reduced procedural delays, and improved overall administrative effectiveness.

5. Quality Assurance and Accreditation Support

The Registrar's Office played a proactive role in supporting institutional quality assurance initiatives during the year. Extensive administrative support was provided to the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and various quality enhancement activities undertaken by the University.

The administration actively facilitated the collection, verification, and compilation of institutional data required for quality assessment and accreditation processes. Significant assistance was extended in relation to Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) preparation, documentation, evidence management, and institutional reporting requirements.

Coordination among academic departments, administrative units, and quality assurance committees was strengthened to ensure timely availability of information and effective implementation of quality-related initiatives.

The administrative support extended to quality assurance activities contributed significantly to the University's efforts toward academic excellence, institutional benchmarking, and continuous improvement.

6.Human Resource Administration

The University Administration continued to effectively manage matters related to teaching and non-teaching personnel. Various service-related cases concerning appointments, promotions, confirmations, leave, retirement benefits, service records, and administrative approvals were processed in accordance with applicable regulations and government directives.

Efforts were made to ensure transparency, procedural fairness, and timely disposal of service matters. Administrative support was extended to faculty members and staff to facilitate smooth functioning of academic and administrative units.

The administration also emphasized maintaining updated personnel records and ensuring compliance with service rules and statutory provisions. Regular review of staffing requirements and institutional needs was undertaken to support the University's academic expansion and developmental priorities.

7.Reservation Policy Compliance and Roster Management

Ensuring social justice and regulatory compliance remained a key administrative priority. During the year, the University undertook systematic review, updating, and maintenance of reservation rosters in accordance with applicable government policies and reservation norms.

Verification and validation exercises were conducted to ensure accuracy of roster records and compliance with statutory provisions. Necessary administrative actions were undertaken to facilitate reservation-related processes in recruitment and service matters.

These efforts reinforced the University's commitment to equity, inclusiveness, and constitutional values.

8.Student-Centric Administrative Services

The University Administration remained committed to providing efficient and responsive services to students. Administrative coordination was strengthened to facilitate timely processing of student-related matters including examinations, admissions, scholarships, migration certificates, degree issuance, verification requests, and various academic certifications.

Close coordination among examination, academic, finance, and student welfare sections ensured smooth delivery of services. Special emphasis was placed on reducing response time and improving accessibility of administrative support for students.

The administration also contributed significantly to ensuring that student grievances and procedural issues were addressed promptly through coordinated institutional mechanisms.

9.Grievance Redressal and Public Accountability

A robust grievance redressal framework continued to function throughout the year. The administration processed and resolved grievances received from students, faculty members, employees, affiliated colleges, and members of the public.

Applications received under the Right to Information Act, 2005 were handled in accordance with prescribed timelines and statutory requirements. Public representations, complaints, and requests for information were addressed through transparent and accountable mechanisms.

The emphasis on responsiveness and citizen-centric governance strengthened public confidence in institutional administration and promoted greater transparency in University functioning.

10.Environmental Sustainability and Green Governance

In alignment with the University's commitment to sustainability, the administration actively supported various initiatives related to environmental conservation, campus cleanliness, energy conservation, and green campus development.

Administrative assistance was extended for plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns, resource conservation initiatives, and awareness programmes promoting environmental responsibility. Efforts were made to integrate sustainability considerations into routine administrative practices, including promotion of digital documentation and reduction of paper consumption.

These initiatives contributed to the development of an environmentally conscious institutional culture consistent with national and global sustainability goals.

11.Institutional Events and Academic Support

The administration provided logistical, procedural, and organizational support for numerous academic, cultural, extension, and co-curricular activities conducted during the year. National and international observances, seminars, workshops, conferences, student engagement programmes, and outreach activities received necessary administrative facilitation.

The collaborative approach adopted by administrative units ensured smooth conduct of institutional events and strengthened stakeholder engagement across the University ecosystem.

12.Towards a Future-Ready Administration

The cumulative impact of the initiatives undertaken during Academic Year 2025–26 has been reflected in improved administrative efficiency, greater transparency, enhanced digital readiness, strengthened regulatory compliance, and better stakeholder services. The University Administration continued to evolve as a responsive and enabling system supporting the broader mission of academic excellence, quality enhancement, innovation, and inclusive growth.

Looking ahead, Siddharth University remains committed to further strengthening digital governance, institutional effectiveness, quality assurance mechanisms, sustainable administrative practices, and stakeholder-centric service delivery. The administration will continue to support the University's strategic vision through efficient governance, collaborative leadership, and continuous institutional improvement.

The achievements of the year reaffirm the University's determination to build a modern, accountable, and future-oriented administrative framework capable of supporting the aspirations of a rapidly growing higher education institution.



**'Strengthening Financial Sustainability through Prudent Stewardship,
Strategic Investment and Institutional Resilience'**

The Financial Year 2025–26 was marked by prudent financial management, fiscal discipline, and sustained investment in institutional development. Guided by the principles of transparency, accountability, statutory compliance, and long-term sustainability, Siddharth University continued to strengthen its financial position while supporting academic excellence, examination reforms, infrastructure development, student services, and quality enhancement initiatives.

The Finance Office played a central role in ensuring effective budgetary planning, expenditure monitoring, financial reporting, fund management, and compliance with statutory requirements. Through systematic financial oversight and responsible stewardship of resources, the University successfully balanced recurring operational commitments with developmental priorities, thereby contributing to institutional stability and growth.

1. Financial Management and Governance

Throughout the year, the University adhered to established financial regulations, Government guidelines, audit requirements, and statutory provisions governing financial administration. Continuous monitoring of expenditure, regular reconciliation of accounts, and timely financial reporting strengthened accountability and enhanced transparency in financial operations.

The Finance Office maintained a robust internal control framework to ensure efficient utilization of resources and alignment of financial decisions with the University's strategic objectives. Particular emphasis was placed on supporting academic quality, examination management, digital transformation, infrastructure enhancement, research promotion, and student welfare.

2. Expenditure Profile and Resource Utilization

The University's total expenditure during FY 2025–26 amounted to approximately ₹68.04 crore, reflecting the scale and diversity of its academic, administrative, examination, and developmental activities.

Human resource expenditure remained a major component of institutional spending. Approximately ₹19.48 crore was incurred towards salaries and employee-related benefits, accounting for nearly 29 percent of total expenditure. This investment underscores the University's commitment to maintaining a qualified and motivated academic and administrative workforce capable of delivering quality higher education.

The University also invested significantly in the conduct of examinations and evaluation processes. Expenditure exceeding ₹6.19 crore was incurred on examination administration, confidential printing, evaluation, remuneration of examination personnel, logistics, answer-book processing, and result management. These expenditures supported the smooth conduct of examinations across a large network of affiliated institutions while maintaining the integrity and credibility of the assessment process.

Administrative and general expenditure amounted to approximately ₹3.68 crore, supporting governance systems, information technology services, utilities, security arrangements, office administration, statutory compliance, audit functions, and institutional support services.

Additional financial support was provided for library services, departmental academic activities, student welfare programmes, sports and cultural events, quality enhancement initiatives, research support, faculty development programmes, and campus maintenance activities.

3. Capital Formation and Developmental Investment

The University's expenditure profile reflects a balanced approach towards immediate operational requirements and long-term institutional development. Capital expenditure, including additions to fixed assets and ongoing capital works, amounted to approximately ₹9.5 crore during the year.

Consequently, nearly 14 percent of total expenditure was devoted to capital formation and infrastructure strengthening, while approximately 86 percent supported recurring academic and operational activities. This Revenue Expenditure to Capital Expenditure ratio of 86:14 demonstrates a healthy financial structure wherein operational efficiency is complemented by sustained investment in future growth and institutional capacity building.

The capital expenditure incurred during the year contributed to infrastructure enhancement, campus development, technology upgradation, academic facilities, and strengthening of institutional assets.

4. Asset Base and Institutional Capacity

The University continued to strengthen its long-term asset base during FY 2025–26. The gross value of fixed assets reflects sustained investments in academic buildings, laboratories, administrative facilities, information technology infrastructure, campus utilities, and other institutional resources.

Notably, capital assets constituted nearly 72 percent of the University's total asset portfolio, indicating a strong physical and infrastructural foundation that supports teaching, learning, research, innovation, and community engagement. The continued expansion and maintenance of institutional assets demonstrate the University's commitment to creating a modern and enabling academic environment.

5. Financial Sustainability and Resilience

The audited financial statements reveal several positive indicators of financial sustainability and institutional resilience.

The University's Capital Income to Capital Expenditure Ratio remained approximately 2:1, indicating that developmental and capital resources were more than sufficient to finance infrastructure development and asset creation activities during the year. This reflects prudent financial planning and demonstrates that capital investments were supported through dedicated developmental resources.

Similarly, the Revenue Income to Revenue Expenditure Ratio remained close to 1:1, indicating that recurring operational expenditure was largely supported through recurring income streams. This balance reflects a stable operational framework and highlights the University's ability to sustain its academic and administrative activities through regular financial resources.

The University's expenditure pattern, asset creation strategy, and resource utilization practices collectively reflect a balanced approach to growth, sustainability, and fiscal responsibility.

6. Investments, Liquidity and Long-Term Stability

The University maintained a sound financial position through prudent management of investments, earmarked funds, and designated resources. Investments supporting various institutional funds exceeded ₹18 crore, providing stability and support for long-term developmental commitments.

The University also maintained healthy liquidity levels, with adequate level of current assets exceeding, ensuring operational flexibility and timely fulfilment of institutional obligations. Strong liquidity enhances the University's ability to support academic activities, infrastructure development, and strategic initiatives without disruption.

These indicators reflect a robust financial foundation capable of supporting future growth, responding to emerging challenges, and sustaining institutional development over the long term.

7. Digital Financial Management and Process Reforms

During the year, the Finance Office continued to strengthen technology-enabled financial administration. Computerized accounting systems, digital record maintenance, electronic payment mechanisms, and improved financial reporting practices enhanced operational efficiency, transparency, and accountability.

The continued integration of digital financial processes with broader institutional e-governance initiatives contributed to improved service delivery, faster transaction processing, and more effective financial oversight.

Conclusion

The financial position of Siddharth University during FY 2025–26 remained stable, sustainable, and development-oriented. The University successfully maintained a balanced expenditure structure, strengthened its infrastructure base, enhanced financial resilience, and supported its expanding academic and administrative responsibilities through prudent resource management.

Key indicators—including a Revenue Expenditure to Capital Expenditure ratio of 86:14, a Capital Income to Capital Expenditure ratio of approximately 2:1, a Revenue Income to Revenue Expenditure ratio of approximately 1:1, a capital asset base, investments, and current assets—collectively demonstrate the University's financial strength, operational stability, and long-term sustainability.

The Finance Office remains committed to advancing financial transparency, strengthening governance systems, promoting efficient utilization of resources, and supporting the University's vision of academic excellence, innovation, inclusiveness, and sustainable institutional growth.

Brief Report of the Controller of Examination

The Office of the Controller of Examinations (CoE), Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharth Nagar, continued to play a central role in maintaining the integrity, credibility, transparency, and efficiency of the University's examination and evaluation system during the Academic Year 2025–26. As one of the most critical administrative and academic units of the University, the Examination Department remained committed to ensuring the timely conduct of examinations, secure management of confidential processes, prompt declaration of results, and effective delivery of student services.

The year witnessed significant achievements in examination administration, result processing, degree issuance, digitalization of workflows, and enhancement of student support services. Through coordinated efforts involving the University administration, affiliated colleges, examination centres, faculty members, evaluators, and technical teams, the University successfully managed examination-related activities for thousands of students across undergraduate, postgraduate, professional, and research programmes. The team of examination includes:

Examination Administration Framework:

The Examination Department functions through three specialized sections, namely:

1. Examination General Section

The Examination General Section is responsible for managing the operational aspects of examinations. Its major functions include:

- Processing online examination applications.
- Verification and preservation of examination records received from affiliated colleges.
- Identification and allocation of examination centres.
- Appointment of Centre Superintendents and Assistant Superintendents.
- Coordination of examination schedules and logistics.
- Declaration of examination results.
- Issuance of degrees and certificates.

Processing and online payment of remuneration to examination functionaries, including Centre Superintendents, Assistant Centre Superintendents, Invigilators, and Relievers.

The section continued to streamline examination management through increased use of digital platforms, thereby enhancing efficiency and transparency.

2. Confidential and Highly Confidential Section

The Confidential Section serves as the custodian of examination secrecy and security. During the year, the section successfully managed:

- Moderation of question papers received from Boards of Studies and subject experts.
- Preparation, printing, and secure handling of examination papers.
- Maintenance of confidentiality throughout the examination cycle.
- Distribution of question papers to examination centres.
- Safe preservation of original question papers and confidential records in secured strong-room facilities.
- Strict confidentiality protocols and monitoring mechanisms ensured the integrity and credibility of the University's assessment system.

3. Records Section

The Records Section continued to provide essential academic documentation services. Its major responsibilities include:

- Maintenance of examination records and tabulation registers.
- Issuance and correction of marksheets.
- Preservation of historical examination data.
- Verification of academic credentials.
- Support for migration, transcript, and degree-related services.

The section has increasingly adopted digital record management practices to improve retrieval efficiency and service delivery.

A. Scale of Examination Operations

The University continues to witness substantial growth in its academic and examination activities. During the Academic Year 2025–26, examinations were successfully conducted for students enrolled across the University campus and affiliated institutions.

A total of 280 affiliated colleges and institutions, including the University campus, participated in the examination process. To facilitate smooth conduct of examinations, the University established 224 examination centres across its jurisdiction.

The large-scale coordination required for conducting examinations across multiple districts was accomplished through systematic planning, extensive monitoring, and collaborative engagement with institutional stakeholders.

B. Degree Distribution and Academic Certification

One of the significant achievements during the year was the successful distribution of degrees to students who completed their academic programmes.

During the academic session 2024–25, the University issued and distributed degrees to a total of 53,986 students, comprising during the 9th convocation held on 10th November 2025:

The figures reflect both the expanding reach of the University and its commitment to ensuring timely certification of academic achievements.

Notably, female students constituted approximately 62.4% of the total degree recipients, demonstrating the growing participation of women in higher education within the University's jurisdiction.

A. Conduct of Odd Semester Examinations

The Odd Semester Examinations for the Academic Year 2025–26 was conducted between 10 December 2025 and 21 February 2026.

- Despite the scale and diversity of programmes covered, the University ensured:
- Timely scheduling of examinations.
- Secure distribution of confidential materials.
- Effective supervision of examination centres.
- Adherence to examination regulations.
- Efficient coordination with affiliated institutions.

The University demonstrated considerable improvement in result processing efficiency, with examination results being declared between 09 February 2026 and 04 April 2026, ensuring minimal delay between examination completion and publication of results.

B. Conduct of Even Semester Examinations

The Even Semester Examination cycle represented one of the largest examination exercises undertaken by the University during the year.

A total of 67,229 students were registered for the examinations, comprising:

The examinations were conducted between 21 April 2026 and 26 May 2026 under strict monitoring and quality assurance mechanisms.

The University successfully completed evaluation processes and declared final-year undergraduate and postgraduate results between 20 May 2026 and 08 June 2026, reflecting its commitment to timely academic progression and student mobility.

A. Examination Outcomes

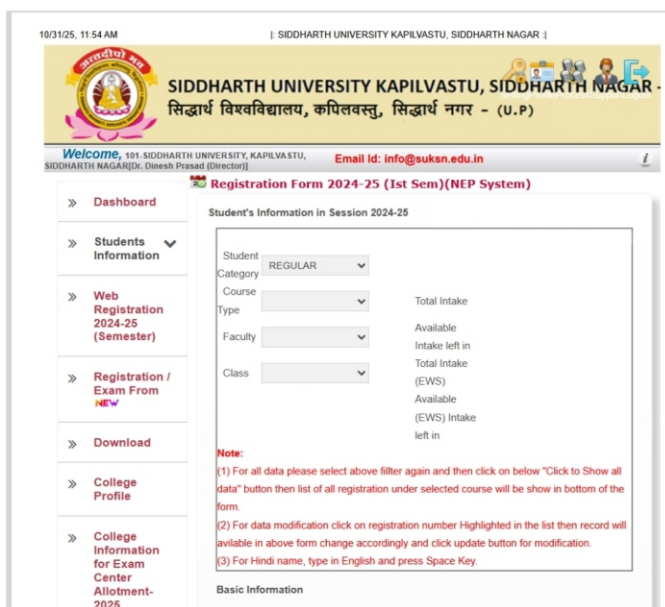
The overall performance of students in the Even Semester Examination 2025–26 remained encouraging.

Out of the total registered students, across the University and its affiliated colleges, 52,151 students successfully passed, including:

The overall pass percentage stood at approximately 77.57%, over all and 72.74% reflecting the academic rigor, preparedness of students and the effectiveness of teaching-learning processes across the departments in the University as well as affiliated institutions.

Female students continued to demonstrate strong academic performance, accounting for around 63% of the successful candidates.



A. Digitization and Process Improvement

The Examination Department continued its efforts toward modernization and digital transformation. Key initiatives included:

- Online examination application management.
- Digital processing of examination-related records.
- Online remuneration modules for examination personnel.
- Improved result processing workflows.
- Enhanced coordination with affiliated colleges through digital communication platforms.
- Strengthening of examination database management systems.

These initiatives have significantly reduced processing time, improved transparency, and enhanced stakeholder satisfaction.

B. Quality Assurance and Examination Integrity

The University maintained a strong focus on examination quality and integrity throughout the year. Several measures were adopted, including:

- Secure question paper management systems.
- Multi-level moderation of examination papers.
- Strengthening confidentiality protocols.
- Monitoring of examination centres.
- Timely resolution of examination-related grievances.
- Standardization of evaluation procedures.
- These efforts contributed to maintaining the credibility and reliability of the University's assessment processes.

C. Recognition of Academic Excellence

The University continued its tradition of recognizing outstanding academic achievement through medals and scholarships. For the 10th Convocation Ceremony, 2026, the University proposed the conferment of:

- 37 University Medals to students securing the highest marks in their respective programmes.
- 12 Donor Medals sponsored through philanthropic contributions.
- 1 Donor Scholarship for meritorious academic performance.

These recognitions reflect the University's commitment to promoting excellence, merit, and academic distinction.

Looking Ahead

The Office of the Controller of Examinations remains committed to further strengthening examination governance through technology-enabled solutions, enhanced data management systems, automation of examination processes, and continuous quality improvement.

Future priorities include:

- Expansion of digital examination services.
- Strengthening data security and confidentiality systems.
- Further reduction in result declaration timelines.
- Enhanced student-centric examination services.
- Integration of advanced examination management technologies.
- Continuous improvement of transparency, accountability, and operational efficiency.

Through its sustained efforts, the Office of the Controller of Examinations continues to uphold the highest standards of academic integrity and assessment excellence, contributing significantly to the realization of Siddharth University's vision of quality higher education and institutional excellence.

Brief Report of Research and Development Cell

The Research & Development (R&D) Cell of Siddharth University serves as the nodal body for promoting a vibrant research ecosystem in alignment with the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The Cell is committed to fostering quality research, innovation, interdisciplinary collaboration, consultancy, intellectual property generation, and resource mobilization through partnerships with academic institutions, industries, and funding agencies. It facilitates research planning, project development, capacity building, technology transfer, and dissemination of research outcomes, thereby contributing to the University's vision of academic excellence and societal impact. The establishment and strengthening of institutional research support mechanisms under national initiatives such as PM-USHA have further enhanced the University's research capabilities. The role of R&D Cells in strengthening institutional research ecosystems is widely recognized in higher education reforms under NEP 2020 and PM-USHA initiatives.

Annual Progress during 2025–26

The academic year 2025–26 witnessed significant progress in research, innovation, and knowledge creation at Siddharth University. A major milestone was the establishment of the Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF) under the PM-USHA Scheme, providing advanced research infrastructure and shared access to sophisticated scientific instruments for faculty members, research scholars, and students. The facility is expected to strengthen high-quality research, interdisciplinary collaborations, and externally funded projects across various disciplines. PM-USHA specifically emphasizes strengthening research infrastructure and innovation capacity in universities.

A major highlight of the year has been the University's success in the area of intellectual property generation. Siddharth University achieved a significant milestone with twelve (12) patents granted or published in diverse fields spanning both science and humanities. These accomplishments underscore the University's commitment to promoting high-quality research, encouraging creativity and innovation, and translating scholarly work into tangible societal and technological benefits. The achievement reflects the growing culture of innovation among faculty members and researchers and positions the University as an emerging hub of intellectual and technological advancement.

The University has witnessed remarkable growth in attracting external research funding. Over the past three years, Siddharth University has successfully undertaken approximately thirty-eight externally funded research projects supported by various national funding agencies and research institutions. This achievement demonstrates the increasing confidence of funding bodies in the

University's research capabilities and highlights the institution's expanding network of academic and scientific collaborations.

The total external grant received for these research projects amounts to approximately ₹1.69 crore. These funds have significantly strengthened the University's research infrastructure and facilitated the execution of innovative projects across diverse disciplines. The grants have supported the procurement of research equipment, field investigations, data collection, capacity-building activities, and collaborative research initiatives, thereby enhancing the overall quality and impact of research conducted at the University.

To nurture emerging research ideas, the University continued its In-house Seed Money Grant Scheme, providing financial support to promising faculty-led research projects. The scheme facilitated preliminary investigations, pilot studies, and the development of proposals for larger extramural funding opportunities.

The University's research output demonstrated substantial growth through a significant number of research publications in peer-reviewed, Scopus-indexed, Web of Science, and other reputed journals, along with publications in conference proceedings and edited volumes. Faculty members of Siddharth University have demonstrated commendable scholarly productivity during the reporting period. More than 165 research papers were published by faculty members in reputed national and international journals during the last academic year. These publications contribute to the advancement of knowledge across various disciplines and reflect the dedication of the University's academic community toward excellence in research. The increasing number and quality of publications have enhanced the University's visibility and reputation in the academic and research landscape.

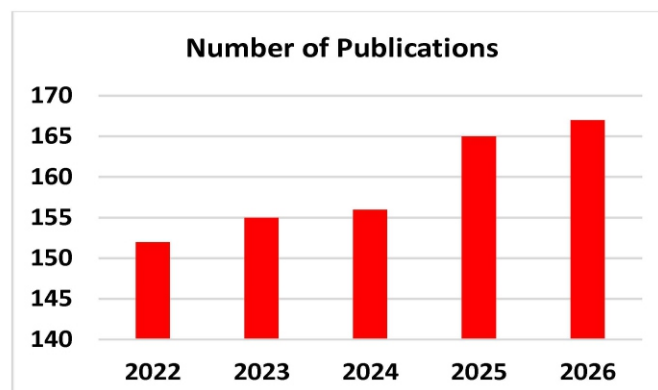
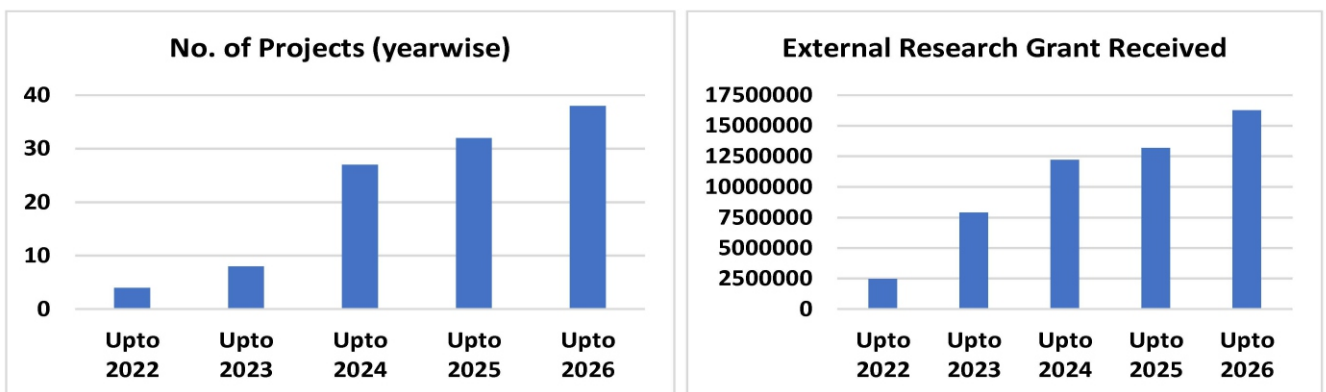

Message from the Dean, Faculty of Arts

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

1. **Name of the Department:** History

2. **Year of Establishment :** Dec. 2020

3. **Brief profile of the department:** The Department of History at Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharthnagar has been continuously progressing in academic, research, and co-curricular activities since its establishment in the academic session 2020–2021. The department has made remarkable achievements in teaching, research, student enrolment, and institutional responsibilities during the session 2025–2026.

At the time of establishment of the department, Dr. Sachchidanand Chaubey was appointed as Associate Professor and Head of the Department, while Dr. Yashwant Yadav was appointed as Assistant Professor against the sanctioned posts in the department. Under their academic guidance and administrative leadership, the department has continuously moved forward towards excellence. In the establishment year of the department, only 06 students were enrolled in the postgraduate programme. Due to the increasing interest of students towards the subject and the continuous academic efforts of the department, the number of students has significantly increased over the years. In the current academic session 2025–2026, a total of 30 students have taken admission in the M.A. History programme, which reflects the growing popularity and academic credibility of the department.

The postgraduate programme is being conducted successfully with active participation of students in classroom learning, seminars, presentations, group discussions, project work, and research-oriented activities. Students are also being encouraged to develop analytical and research skills through academic assignments, field-based learning, and participation in university-level programmes. The undergraduate programme in History, started in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 from the session 2021–2022, is also functioning successfully. Message from the Dean, Faculty of Science

It gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report 2025–26 of the Faculty of Science, Siddharth University. The report reflects the academic achievements, research advancements, infrastructure development, and outreach activities undertaken by the Faculty during the year. It also highlights our continued commitment to excellence in teaching, research, innovation, and societal engagement.

Established in 2021, the Faculty of Science has emerged as an important centre of higher learning and research in the region. The Faculty currently offers undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programmes in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Biotechnology, Zoology, Home Science, and Environmental Science. A postgraduate programme in Environmental Science was introduced on a self-financed basis in 2025, further expanding academic opportunities for students. In line with emerging educational needs, proposals have also been initiated to start BCA and B.Sc. (Agriculture) programmes from July 2026.

The Faculty is supported by a dedicated team of 20 faculty members comprising one Emeritus Professor, five Professors, two Associate Professors, and twelve Assistant Professors. Their contributions in teaching, research, innovation, and academic leadership have earned recognition at national and international levels. Several faculty members have received prestigious awards and have been elected as fellows of reputed scientific academies, reflecting the academic strength of the Faculty.

A major focus of the Faculty during the year has been the strengthening of research infrastructure. The Department of Mathematics continues to provide advanced computational facilities through a computer laboratory equipped with 40 computers and software packages such as MATLAB and Mathematica. The Department of Physics has established a workstation facility with Linux-based Gaussian 16 software for computational research in Molecular Modelling and Biophysics. The department has also developed a Nano-Science and Nanotechnology Laboratory equipped with advanced synthesis instruments and a modern fume hood facility.

The Departments of Botany and Zoology have significantly enhanced their research capabilities through specialized laboratories. The Department of Botany has developed the Phyto-diversity and Plant Genetics Laboratory, the Microalgal Biotechnology Laboratory, and the Cytogenetics and Ecotoxicology Laboratory. Similarly, the Department of Zoology has established the Aquanutri Innovation and Research Laboratory, the Molecular Biology and Protein Biochemistry Research Laboratory, and the Molecular Endocrinology Research Laboratory. These facilities are creating new opportunities for interdisciplinary and application-oriented research.

One of the most significant achievements of the year was the inauguration of the Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF) Laboratory by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. Kavita Shah on 3 September 2025. The CIF Laboratory is expected to serve as a common platform for advanced scientific research and is likely to become one of the pioneering facilities of its kind under the academic jurisdiction of Siddharth University. The establishment of this facility represents an important step toward strengthening research culture in a rural university setting and promoting high-quality scientific investigations.

The programmes offered by the Department are designed to meet the demand of academia and industry, where students gain a deeper understanding of Advanced Mathematics through a wide range of subjects, including Geometry, Calculus, Algebra, Numerical Analysis, Linear Algebra, Differential Equations, Mathematical Analysis, and Mathematical Modelling. Our programmes include skill enhancement courses such as Mathematical Aptitude and Reasoning, Co-Curricular Ability/Enhancement courses, MS Office, LaTeX, MATLAB, and a course on the Indian Knowledge System (IKS), such as Vedic Mathematics. For hands-on experience on the computational tools, the Department offers practical courses based on MATLAB, MATHEMATICA, PYTHON, R-Programming, etc. The Department has ICT-enabled classrooms with a computer lab (Ramanujan Computer Laboratory) equipped with sophisticated computational software/tools. The faculty members of the Department utilize ICT tools, a modeling and simulation approach, along with the traditional methods for teaching and learning. The most unique feature of the department is providing study material to the students on Google Classroom. Students have access to study materials from Google Classroom at any time, from anywhere. The Department of Mathematics is supported by the National Board of Higher Mathematics (NBHM) under the Complementary Book Support Scheme. The Department of Mathematics conducts separate classes for various competitive examinations, including the NET and GATE. The Department aims to promote research in diverse areas of Mathematical Sciences, Fractal Calculus and Geometry, Hypergeometric Functions and Series, and Computational Fluid Mechanics and Nanofluids.

- 3. Brief profile of the department:**

The Department of Zoology at Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, U.P., was established with the vision of fostering excellence in teaching and research in animal sciences. A milestone was achieved in the academic session 2022–23 with the commencement of post-graduate teaching in Zoology, adding to the Department's academic depth and outreach. In addition, the Department offers a three-year B.Sc. Zoology program (2024–2027 batch) and a four-year B.Sc. Zoology program (2025 onwards) at the undergraduate level, fully aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP-2020). The undergraduate course follows a four-year program designed to provide both conceptual knowledge and practical skills. The Department also offers a Ph.D. program in Zoology, where research scholars are engaged in diverse research areas of animal sciences.

At present, the Department hosts a vibrant academic community of nearly 150 undergraduate students, and 50 postgraduate students and research scholars. The teaching faculty comprises Associate Professors (01), Assistant Professors (02), and Guest Faculty (04), who are dedicated to mentoring students and shaping their academic and professional growth.

The Department has developed excellent teaching programs and laboratory facilities that support education and research in both classical and contemporary domains of Zoology. Academic and research activities span traditional disciplines such as Fish biology, Endocrinology, Molecular Biology etc. This wide academic coverage reflects the Department's integration of conventional animal sciences with modern research areas.

Research activities in the Department are actively supported through funding from diverse agencies, including the Wellcome trust, ANRF: SERB-SURE scheme, R&D Division of U.P. Higher Education Department, and the Siddharth University Seed Money Grant and Central Instrumentation facility established at Faculty of Science sponsored by PM USHA scheme of GoI. Faculty members are engaged in externally funded research projects, which have been instrumental in advancing the Department's scientific output. In addition, the Department maintains active

A milestone was achieved in the academic session 2022–23 with the commencement of post-graduate teaching in Botany, adding to the Department’s academic depth and outreach. In addition, the Department offers a three-year B.Sc. Biology programme (2024–2025) at the undergraduate level, fully aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP-2020). The Department also offers a Ph.D. programme in Botany, where research scholars are engaged in diverse research areas of plant sciences.

During the period of report, the department hosts a vibrant academic community of 145 undergraduate students, 40 postgraduate students, and 08 research scholars. The teaching faculty comprises Associate Professors (01), Assistant Professors (02), and Guest Faculty (04), who are dedicated to mentoring students and shaping their academic and professional growth.

The Department has developed excellent teaching programmes and laboratory facilities that support education and research in both classical and contemporary domains of Botany. Academic and research activities span traditional disciplines such as Cytotaxonomy, Environmental Microbiology, Floristic Studies, Genetics, Plant Breeding, Phytoremediation, Phycology, and Stress Physiology. This wide academic coverage reflects the Department’s integration of conventional botanical sciences with modern research areas.

Research activities in the Department are actively supported through funding from diverse agencies, including the ANRF: SERB-SURE scheme, CST-UP, R&D Division of U.P. Higher Education Department, and the Siddharth University Seed Money Grant. Faculty members are engaged in externally funded research projects, which have been instrumental in advancing the Department’s scientific output. In addition, the Department maintains active collaborations with reputed national and international institutions such as BHU, CSIR-NBRI, CSIR-CIMAP, BSI, University of Lucknow, University of Patna, and research groups in KRIBB, and ERCE, Poland. These collaborative initiatives have substantially strengthened the Department’s research profile, facilitated the development of advanced infrastructure, and created enhanced opportunities for both faculty and students to participate in high-quality, multidisciplinary research.

Though relatively young, the Department of Botany at Siddharth University has steadily grown into a promising hub of botanical research and higher education in eastern Uttar Pradesh. With its blend of quality teaching, expanding collaborations, and a culture of curiosity and innovation, the Department is committed to academic excellence and to shaping future leaders in the field of plant sciences.

Brief profile of the department:

Department of Biotechnology at Siddharth University, Kapilvastu was established in May 2021. The Department is conducting a regular course of M. Sc. Biotechnology as per Choice Based Credit System (C. B. C. S.), and its first regular academic batch was started in September 2021. The Department is running two batches of M. Sc. 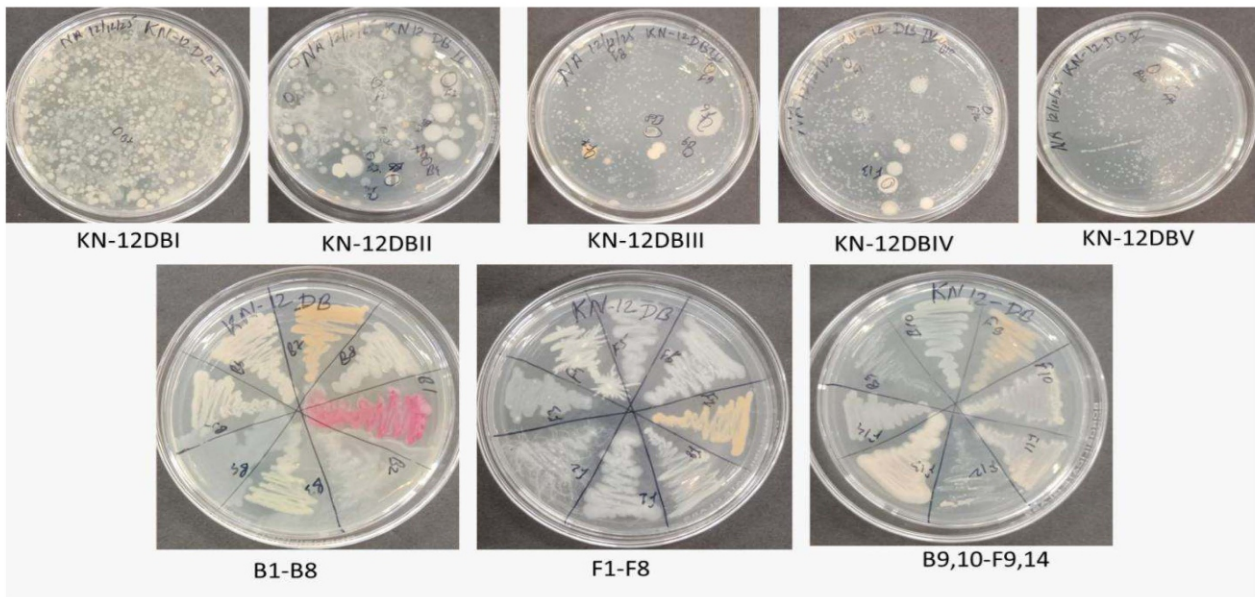

1. National Seminar on “The Comprehensive Philosophy of Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay”

Date: 25 September 2025

On the occasion of the birth anniversary of Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay, the Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay Research Chair, Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharthnagar, organized a National Seminar on the theme “The Comprehensive Philosophy of Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay” on 25 September 2025.

The primary objective of the seminar was to revisit and critically examine Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay’s ideas on Integral Humanism, Antyodaya, Cultural Nationalism, Swadeshi, Self-Reliance, and Welfare State in the contemporary context. The event also aimed to familiarize students and research scholars with the rich tradition of Indian thought and philosophy.

The programme commenced with floral tributes to Goddess Saraswati and Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay, followed by the ceremonial lighting of the lamp. The event was presided over by the Hon’ble Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Kavita Shah, while the distinguished educationist and renowned scholar of Indian thought, Prof. Sadanand Prasad Gupta, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest.

Siddharth University Vocal for Local (SUVOCAL)

To promote self-reliance and sustainable development, this ambitious initiative was adopted. Its primary goal is to strengthen the local economy and enhance entrepreneurship at the grassroots level. The main objectives of the SUVOCAL initiative are:

-  Make rural communities aware of the resources available around them and activate employment opportunities through small-scale schemes.
-  Address the urban influence on Siddharthnagar district, which is a backward region, and guide rural women to rediscover their unique cultural identity.
-  Promote employment-related activities in every region.
-  Foster community spirit and development in rural areas.

Through this initiative, the university has adopted nine villages. Siddharth University also holds a moral responsibility to support sustainable development plans. It aims to enhance the value of locally available resources. For example, the cultivation of dyed cotton is a major product under the ODOP (One District One Product) scheme in Siddharth Nagar, and it has received GI tag recognition. Additionally, rural women are highly skilled, and the university is fulfilling its goal of supporting them through SUVOCAL.

Local efforts are widely appreciated even in remote areas, which helps elevate the region's identity. This initiative will soon be visible on the global map.

Activities Promoted Under This Best Practice:

Promotion of local folk art

1. Preservation of local languages and dialects
2. Empowerment of rural women
3. Awareness about health and hygiene among rural women
4. Organization of festivals and celebrations in the district

Each region has its own unique characteristics, and our primary goal is to elevate them to the national level. A healthy society, unity, and cooperation are essential for the development of any nation. Through SUVOCAL, efforts are being made to build social harmony and conduct awareness campaigns regularly.

3. Inspiration

The inspiration behind SUVOCAL comes from Hon'ble Chancellor and Governor Anandiben Patel Ji, who emphasizes special attention to rural areas. Her vision continues to guide the university family. Her thoughtful ideas benefit us continuously. This initiative is also aligned with the vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Damodardas Modi Ji for a healthy, inclusive, and self-reliant India.

4. Description of the Best Practice

Under the Women Study Centre operated by Siddharth University, the SUVOCAL initiative is being implemented. The university has conducted activities in the adopted villages. Initially, detailed information was provided about the cultural and historical significance of Siddharthnagar district. Villages like Naugarh and Phijgok have ancient archaeological sites. Therefore, villagers were made aware of their heritage and encouraged to preserve it. In the future, these sites will be developed for tourism, and local folk art will be promoted.

Efforts are being made to expand small-scale cultural products under this initiative. Initially, it was observed that most women were not empowered. Therefore, a campaign was launched to empower them, where they were grouped in primary schools during morning hours and trained by teachers. Some women also showed interest in singing and folk music. They were encouraged to perform folk songs with proper rhythm and will be provided platforms in the future. Their songs are also broadcast on social media, gaining popularity.

Under SUVOCAL, activities like embroidery, knitting, and weaving are taught in a simple manner. Women are encouraged to create new designs and make small toys and items, which are then displayed in nearby villages. This helps low-income families buy toys for their children.

5. Success

The university team regularly visits the adopted villages and supports these activities. As a result, women are becoming empowered and folk culture is being promoted. They are making toys and decorative items. They sing folk songs during festivals and also engage in painting and coloring work. Now, more rural people are actively participating in SUVOCAL-related activities.

6. Challenges Faced During Implementation

The university faced initial challenges in implementing SUVOCAL due to the remote location of Siddharth Nagar district. Roads are often damaged during the rainy season, and reaching rural areas requires travel by foot. Vehicles are also needed to reach the university level. Initially, support was taken from village heads, and women groups were formed in primary schools where plans were explained. As a result, more women are participating. Publicity is also being done through social media.

Siddharth University Knowledge Hub (SUKH)

Objectives of the Best Practice

The primary objective of Siddharth University Knowledge Hub (SUKH) is to enhance knowledge accessibility and educational inclusivity through:

1. Creating an online platform and repository where faculty members can upload their lectures, notes, video lectures, etc.
2. Enabling students to upload their project work (assignments), research project reports, and research papers in the future.
3. Making rare manuscripts available online.

Inspiration

The idea of such a knowledge hub emerged during the COVID-19 pandemic when faculty members began conducting online classes and sharing their lectures and notes digitally. As a result, under the guidance of Hon'ble Governor Smt. Anandiben Patel, the goal of creating an online repository was set.

Description of the Best Practice

This is an online hub operating at the local level of Siddharth University and is accessible through the university's website. Each faculty member is provided with a unified login system through which they upload their academic content to the hub.

It is available to all university students. Students can log in to their accounts, view lectures, and ask questions to the concerned faculty members. This has led to the development of an interactive learning system.

Siddharth University is located on the sacred land of Gautam Buddha, and through its efforts, rare manuscripts have been acquired by the university's Buddhist Studies Centre. These manuscripts have been digitized and made available online for research and educational purposes.

Success

Through the Siddharth University Knowledge Hub, students are easily accessing lectures, notes, and other academic materials. Researchers and the general public also have access to rare manuscripts for study and research.

Challenges and Requirements

The hub operates via web-based access, which requires high-speed internet connections—especially for viewing video lectures. The main challenge in accessing the hub is poor internet connectivity outside the university campus, as Siddharth University is located near the India-Nepal border where internet access is limited to a few users (students).

Although the university campus offers free Wi-Fi (500 Mbps), students outside the campus face low internet speed issues. In addition to connectivity, low digital literacy is another major challenge.

To address this, Siddharth University plans to organize various educational programs in nearby areas to improve digital literacy among both students and the general public.

Remarks (Practical Implementation)

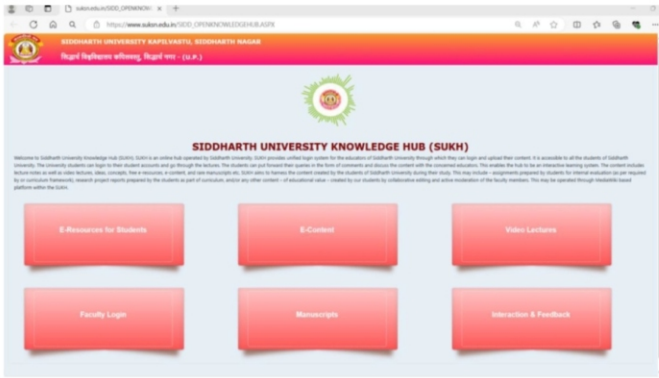
Our future plan includes utilizing content created by students during their academic journey. This will include:

- Any other academic material collaboratively edited and actively moderated by faculty members and students

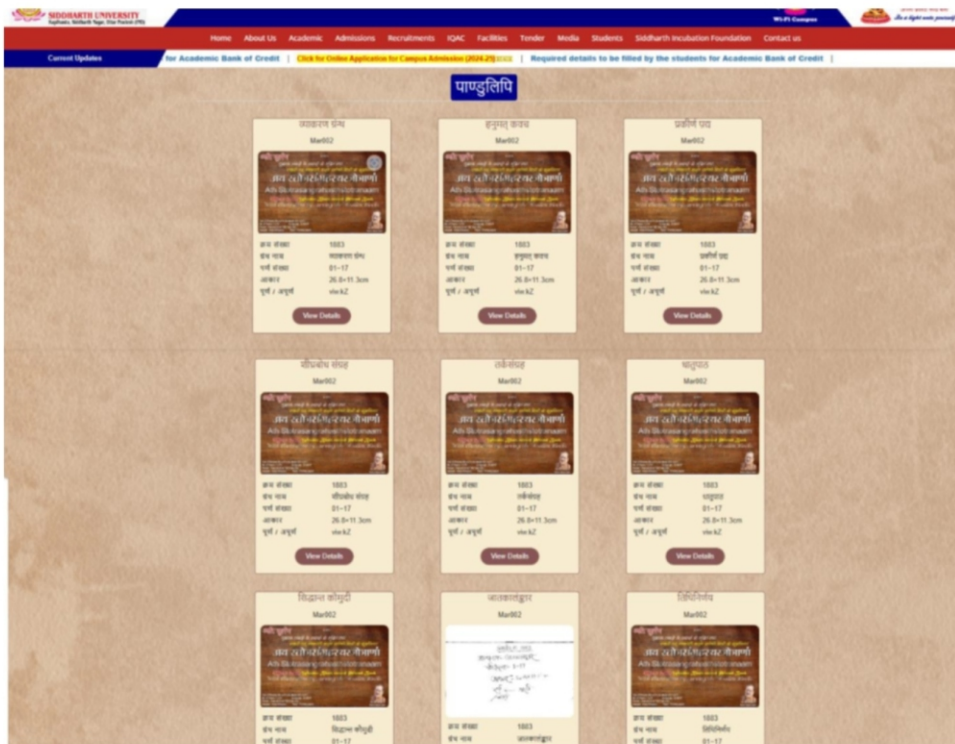
This content will be managed through a media-based platform under SUKH.

It also aims at uploading assignments and research projects by the students in future. It aims to be a platform for online collaborative editing to produce educational content as well.

The Practice

Siddharth University Knowledge Hub (SUKH) is an online hub operated through Siddharth University website and runs on its local server. Dr. Satyam Mishra, Assistant Professor at the Department of Geography is the nodal officer for the smooth operation of the hub. The hub provides unified login system for our educators and website team through which they can login and upload their content.

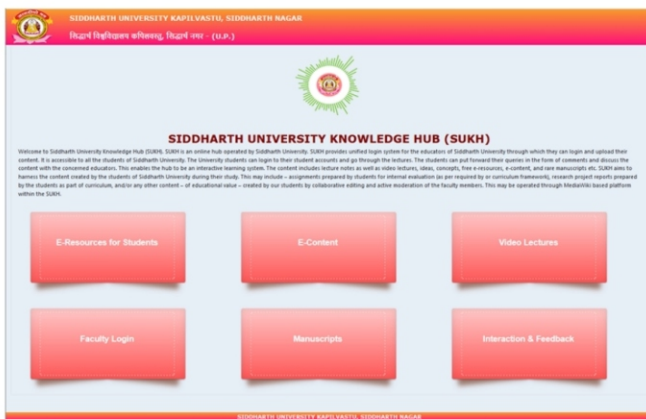
It is accessible to all the students of Siddharth University. The University students can login to their student accounts and go through the lectures. The students can put forward their queries in the form of comments and discuss the content with the concerned educators. This enables the hub to be an interactive learning system.

The content includes the following – lecture notes provided by faculty members, video lectures recorded by faculty members, as well as video recordings of the different lectures organized during seminars, workshops etc.

The uniqueness of the hub is established through the fact that this harnesses the content created and preserves it for future use by the students as well as educators. The content created in this way can be further improved upon and reused and disseminated through the same hub. In future, the expansion of the hub is planned to enable MediaWiki based subdomain where multiple users (including our students) can create, edit, and update content simultaneously and collaboratively. The content produced in this manner shall be available to all whoever has access to internet, i.e. Open to all.

Siddharth University Knowledge Hub (SUKH) has significant e-content of uploaded in the form of study materials, recorded lectures, research outputs/publications and rare manuscripts which enable the students to study and prepare for the concerned programmes. This material can be viewed on the SUKH through our website and the same can be accessed directly by our students as well as general public i.e. Open to All, which is the primary motive and aim of the SUKH.

SUKH includes numerous video lectures which are directly uploaded to our main server and can be accessed through our website link of the hub. Apart from locally hosted videos, we have provided links to various lectures which are uploaded on the YouTube channel of the Siddharth University.

Introduction and Vision

In alignment with Siddharth University's commitment to fostering academic excellence and cultural heritage, the Tathagat International Centre (TIC) stands as a premier guest house facility. Named in honor of the Buddha's epithet, Tathagat, the Centre embodies the principles of dignified hospitality, tranquillity, and efficiency. Located in the sacred geography of Kapilvastu, the TIC serves not merely as an accommodation facility but as a bridge connecting the university to visiting scholars, officials, and families, thereby enriching the campus's intellectual and social fabric.

Eligibility and Purpose

The Centre operates under a structured eligibility framework to ensure equitable access. Accommodation is extended to a wide range of stakeholders, including special invitees of university events, newly appointed faculty members (for a limited initial period), officials on duty, and even parents of students arriving from distant locations upon the recommendation of the respective Hostel Warden. This inclusive policy underscores the university's sensitivity to both professional obligations and familial needs. Furthermore, the Vice-Chancellor retains the discretion to approve stays for any other guest, ensuring flexibility for emergent academic or administrative requirements.

Infrastructure and Facilities

The Tathagat International Centre is designed to cater to diverse needs. Its physical infrastructure includes:

- Tiered Accommodation: A range of options from VVIP Suites (₹5,000/day, max 4 occupants) and VIP Suites (₹2,000/day, max 2) to Ordinary A/C Rooms (₹600/day) and a Dormitory (₹200/day, max 10 occupants), ensuring affordability and choice.
- Community Hall: A dedicated space for conducting meetings, seminars, and small functions.
- Kitchen & Dining Hall: A separate dining facility with fixed meal timings (Breakfast: ₹50, Lunch & Dinner: ₹100 each), reinforcing the rule that rooms are strictly for rest, not for cooking or dining.

Booking, Stay Duration, and Check-in/Out Protocol

To maintain operational discipline, the manual mandates advance booking (preferably two days prior) on a prescribed form, allocated on a first-come, first-serve basis. Standard accommodation is limited to a maximum of three days, with extensions possible only upon 24-hour advance notice and subject to availability. A unique and guest-friendly provision allows check-in at any hour, with a full day calculated as 24 hours from occupation; any fraction beyond 12 hours is billed as an additional full day. Check-out requires clearance of all dues and deposit of the room key for maintenance.

Code of Conduct and Prohibitions

The TIC maintains a strict ethical and environmental code, reflecting the university's values in the sacred region of Kapilvastu:

- Prohibited: Alcoholic beverages, non-vegetarian food, smoking, cooking in rooms, pets, and drying clothes in non-designated areas.
- Mandatory: Cleanliness, tranquillity, switching off electrical appliances when leaving, and using the dining hall exclusively for meals.
- Security: Visitors are allowed only from 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM and must register at the front office. The Centre is not responsible for valuables left in rooms, and damage to property is punishable.

Financial Provisions and Payment

The tariff structure is transparent: 10% of the rent covers electricity and water charges, while 90% is directed toward Centre maintenance. Payment is accepted only in cash (no credit/debit cards) during office hours (10:00 AM – 5:00 PM). Importantly, the Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, and Centre In-charge may authorize complimentary meals. Additionally, visiting Professors (Associate/Assistant) attending university-convened meetings are exempt from meal charges.

Governance and Oversight

The Tathagat International Centre Management Committee (TICMC), chaired by the Vice-Chancellor and including the two senior-most Deans, Finance Officer, Registrar, and Controller of Examinations, provides strategic direction. The Centre In-charge acts as Member-Convener. The Committee's powers include approving capital proposals, staff appointments, annual budgets, and audit reports. It meets at least once every quarter, with special sessions convened as needed.

Special Provisions and Guest Responsibilities

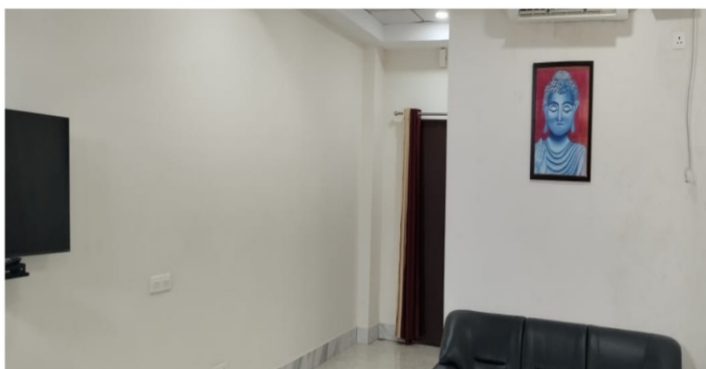
The Centre is clear that accommodation is not a right; the university reserves the right to cancel or refuse bookings without assigning reasons. Foreign nationals must submit passport and visa copies. Newly appointed staff may stay up to seven days with Registrar's approval for extension. Guests are reminded not to accommodate extra persons, and VVIP suites are allotted only on the Vice-Chancellor's recommendation.

Conclusion

The Tathagat International Centre is more than a guest house—it is a microcosm of Siddharth University's commitment to order, respect, and hospitality. By blending administrative rigor with the serene ethos of Kapilvastu, the TIC ensures that every visitor departs with a positive impression of the university's standards and its cultural heritage.

- Counselling Session of Nepalese Students (10th September, 2025, 1:30 PM) A counselling session in association with Psychological Counselling Cell, Siddharth University was conducted for Nepalese students.

Detailed Report:

under the directions of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, a counselling program was organized at Siddharth University for the guidance and counseling of students from Nepal studying in SimaPar, Nepal. The event was jointly organized by the university's International Cell and Psychological Counseling Cell on 10.09.2025 at 1:30 PM in Gautam Buddha Auditorium.

Addressing the program, Dr. Shilpi Srivastava, Chairperson of the Psychological Counseling Cell, said that the mental well-being of international students is as important as their educational development. With this objective, the Psychological Counseling Cell was established. She informed the students that they can seek help from psychological counselors for any problems they may face. Dean of Science Faculty, Prof. Prakriti Rai, emphasized that students should avoid unnecessary comments on digital platforms and adopt responsible behavior.

The University's Chief Proctor, Prof. Deepak Bahu, stated that ensuring the safety and protection of students both inside and outside the campus is the university's top priority. He added that the university administration is always ready to provide students with a family-like supportive environment.

On this occasion, Dean of Student Welfare, Prof. Neeta Yadav, informed students that if they face any kind of problem, they can submit their issues in written form to the Dean of Student Welfare or the Dean of the Faculty of Arts for resolution. The chairman of the University's International Cell, Prof. Saurabh Srivastava, said that the university is committed to providing protection and educational support to international students, especially those coming from Nepal. Referring to the current situation in Nepal, he stated that India and Nepal share deep historical and cultural ties. The environment at Siddharth University is safe, cooperative, and suitable for educational activities, where Indian and Nepali students live together with mutual support and brotherhood.

During the program, students also shared some of their problems, such as:

1. Not getting seats in buses due to overcrowding
2. Need for better bus facilities for students
3. High education fees
4. Problems related to bike passes for new students

Students also raised several other issues.

The program was coordinated and conducted by Dr. Ankita Srivastava, Coordinator of the International Cell. Along with international students, local students were also present. Psychological experts, doctors, and members of the teaching staff attended the event.

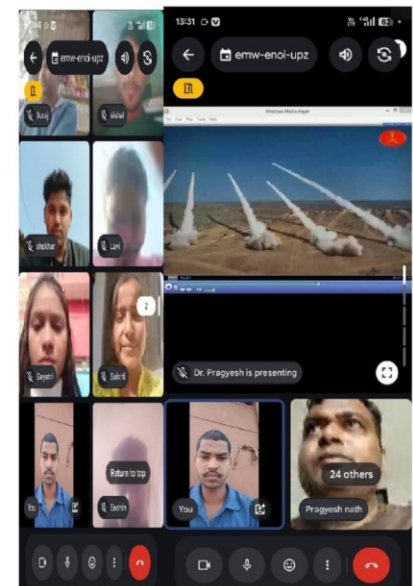

Now the Central library is located in the new fully airconditioned building next to the administrative building. The new Sambodhi Central Library currently is of 2 floors with total surface area of 2222.91 Square meter. It is equipped with central air conditioning, 1 GBPS internet connectivity, and a dedicated data server for the library. Sambodhi Central library have digital library section with 25 computers along with Reading room, discussion rooms, lockers for students and scholars, 1 smart classroom and Auditorium. The Sambodhi Central Library at Siddharth University operates efficiently with RFID and an Integrated Library Management system (ILMS)- SOUL enduring streamlined access to its extensive collection and facilitating digital resources. The library currently boasts a substantial collection of books, rare books, manuscripts, periodicals, journals, Multimedia materials and various other e-resources. In addition to printed materials for academics, the library also offers access to a variety of media resources like Newspapers (Times of India, Dainik Jagran, Amar Ujala, Hindustan, Rastriya Sahara etc.), and magazines (India Today, Yojana, Kurushetra, Prtiyogita Darpan, Chronical, Outlook, The Week, Frontline, Sport Star, Business Today, The Hindu Weekly, Science Reporter, Digit, Manorma Year Book, Haward Business Review, Current Science etc.) catering to both Hindi and English readership. The Sambodhi Central Library at Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharth Nagar (UP) not only house extensive collections but also leverage advanced technologies and collaboration to support research, learning, and scholarly endeavor.

Sambodhi central library have dedicated facility for the specially abled people. This software based facility provides audio output for easier access to reading materials, Enables scanning of books and translation into 100+ Indian and foreign languages. The handicraft and artisan exhibitions received particular appreciation for showcasing traditional skills and sustainable practices. Pottery and earthen-lamp making demonstrations emphasized the importance of indigenous crafts and local traditions. Similarly, nursery and plant exhibitions promoted environmental consciousness and sustainability, encouraging visitors to adopt eco-friendly practices.
